EMS Calls ²	• 5 suspected opioid overdose-related calls in August (58 to date in 2019) - see Figure 1

Naloxone Distribution ⁵	 36 naloxone kits distributed by CK Public Health in August (316 to date in 2019; 184 in 2018) 179 naloxone kits distributed through CK pharmacies in April 2019 (increasing from Feb 2019)
OVERALL	 The number of opioid-overdose related EMS calls and ED visits was similar in August compared to the previous month The year-to-date local rate of ED visits (53.1 per 100,000) is comparable to the provincial rate (51.0 per 100,000)

Deaths ⁴	• 459 deaths between January and March 2019 (1,469 deaths in 2018 or 10.2 deaths per 100,000)
OVERALL	 The number of ED visits in August was comparable to July and still at lower levels compared to previous months

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Figure 1. Opioid overdose-related ED visits and EMS calls, Chatham-Kent, Apr 2017- August 2019





Figure 2. Rates of opioid overdose-related ED visits, hospitalizations and deaths, Chatham-Kent, 2005-18

⁴ Deaths were obtained from <u>Public Health Ontario's Interactive Opioid Tool</u>. Data for 2018 are considered preliminary and are subject to change as remaining cases are closed by the Office of the Chief Coroner of Ontario. The data include both confirmed and probable cases.

⁵ Naloxone kits distributed by CK Public Health are tracked internally. The number of kits distributed in 2019 by Chatham-Kent pharmacies was available up to April 2019 through the Ontario Drug Policy Research Network Prescription Opioid Tool.

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³ Emergency department visits were provided by the Ontario Ministry of Health and Long-Term Care (Weekly emergency department visits for opioid overdose Week 23: September 2-8, 2019). All Ontario hospitals are required to report cases of opioid overdose presenting in their EDs to the Canadian Institute for Health Information. Results are considered preliminary and subject to change as emergency departments continue to submit data. Rates are based on 2019 population projections.
