

Two more Chatham-Kent residents have tested positive for COVID-19. Both cases, although unrelated, are associated with travel.

One male, aged 38, is hospitalized in stable condition after returning from the US on March 15<sup>th</sup>.

A second male, aged 66, is self-isolating at home after coming into close contact with a visitor from Italy on March 14<sup>th</sup>. CK Public Health officials are connecting with close contacts of these cases. The contacts are being directed to self-isolate for 14 days.

CK Public Health continues to stress the importance of practicing social distancing, following good hand hygiene, and avoiding all unnecessary trips outside of your home.
