EMS Calls²	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• 13 suspected opioid overdose-related calls in September (125 to date in 2020) (Figure 1)• 4 suspected non-opioid drug overdose-related calls in September (72 to date in 2020)
Emergency Department Visits³	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• 10 opioid overdose-related ED visits by CK residents in September (99 to date in 2020 or 93.1 per 100,000) (Figure 1)
Deaths⁴	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• 5 deaths between January and May 2020 (4.7 per 100,000; 6 deaths in 2019)
Naloxone Distribution⁵	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• 33 naloxone kits distributed by CK Public Health in September (359 to date in 2020)• 189 naloxone kits distributed through CK pharmacies in August (August 2020 YTD: 1,157; 2019 Total: 1,413)
OVERALL	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• The number of opioid-overdose related EMS calls and ED visits in September were similar to the previous month. The year to date rate of ED visits was higher in Chatham-Kent compared to Ontario (93.1 versus 54.1 per 100,000)

Figure 1. Opioid overdose-related ED visits and EMS calls, Chatham-Kent, Jan 2019 to Sept 2020

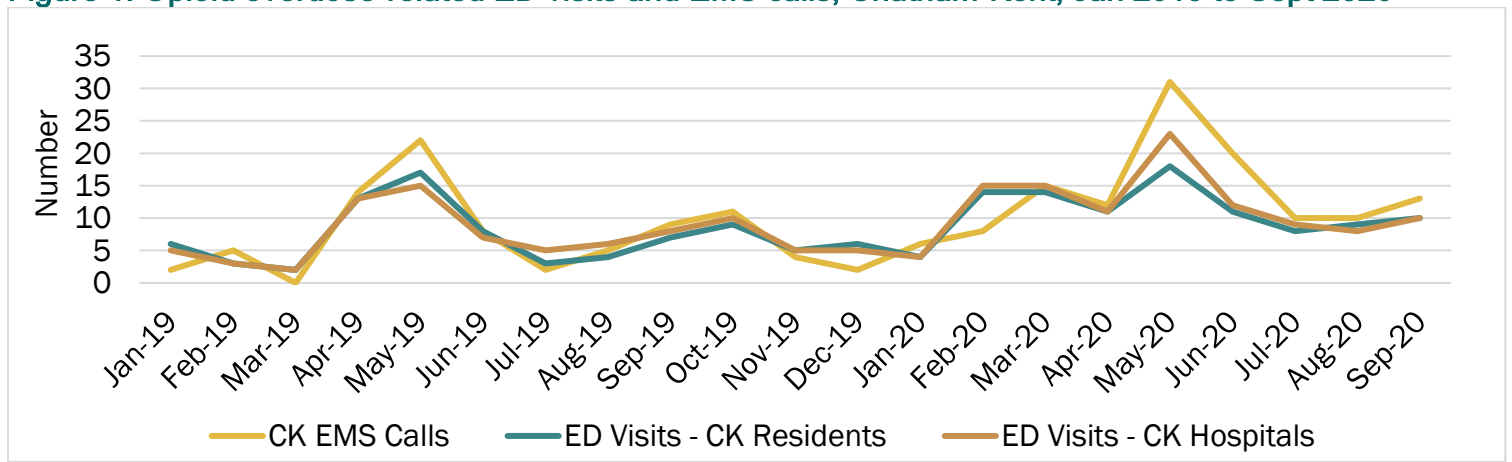
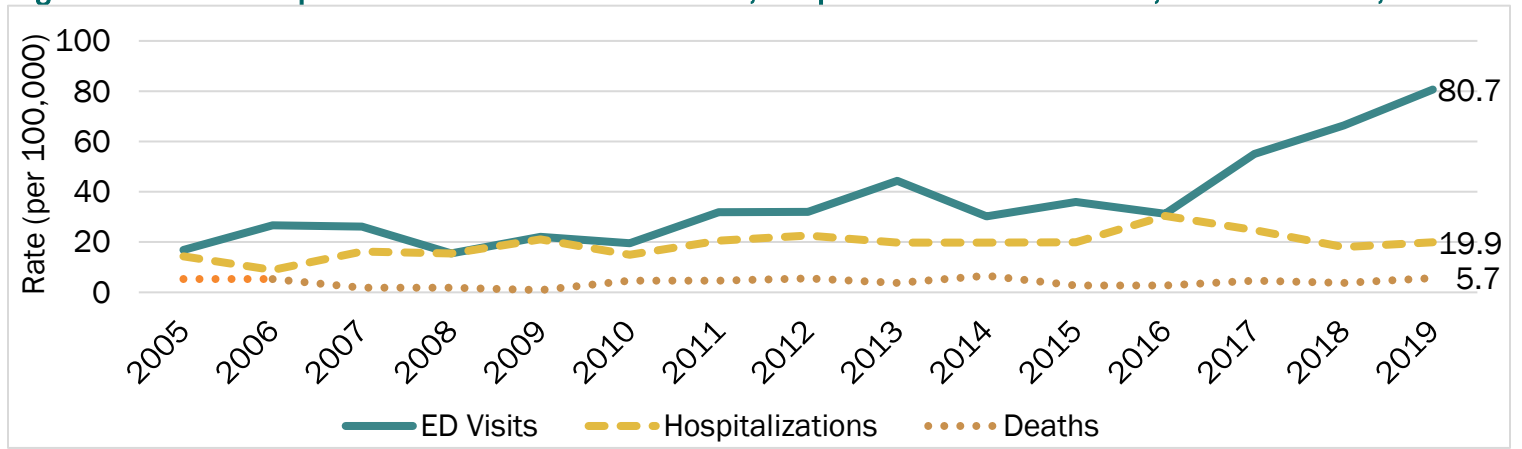


Figure 2. Rates⁴ of opioid overdose-related ED visits, hospitalizations and deaths, Chatham-Kent, 2005-19

- ²EMS calls were provided by Chatham-Kent EMS (October 14, 2020)
- ³Emergency department visits were provided by the Ontario Ministry of Health and Long-Term Care (Weekly emergency department visits for opioid overdose Week 28: Oct 5 - 11, 2020). All Ontario hospitals are required to report cases of opioid overdose presenting in their EDs to the Canadian Institute for Health Information. Results are considered preliminary and subject to change as emergency departments continue to submit data. Rates are based on 2020 population projections.
- ⁴2020 death data are based on the Coroner's Opioid Investigative Aid, January 2019 to May 2020, Office of the Chief Coroner for Ontario, extracted Aug 17, 2020. Data include confirmed deaths only, are considered preliminary and are subject to change. 2005 to 2019 ED visits, hospitalizations and deaths were obtained from Public Health Ontario's [Interactive Opioid Tool](#). 2019 death data are also considered preliminary and are subject to change as remaining cases are closed by the Office of the Chief Coroner of Ontario - the data includes confirmed deaths only.
- ⁵Naloxone kits distributed by CK Public Health are tracked through NEO as part of the Ontario Harm Reduction Database initiative. The number of kits distributed in 2020 by Chatham-Kent pharmacies was available up to August 2020 through the [Ontario Drug Policy Research Network Prescription Opioid Tool](#).

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
