EMS Calls ²	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• 6 suspect opioid poisoning-related calls to CK EMS in June (30 to date in 2023) (Figure 1)• 8 non-opioid drug related calls to CK EMS in June (56 to date in 2023)
Emergency Department Visits ³	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• 9 opioid poisoning-related ED visits <u>by CK residents</u> in June (43 to date in 2023 or 39.6 per 100,000) (Figure 1)• 11 opioid poisoning-related ED visits <u>to CK hospitals</u> in June (52 to date in 2023)
Deaths ⁴	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• 1 suspect drug-related death in CK in June (16 to date in 2023 or 14.7 per 100,000; 45 deaths in 2022) (Figure 1)• 4 confirmed opioid poisoning deaths in CK between January and March 2023 (36 deaths in 2022 or 33.3 per 100,000) (Figure 1)
OVERALL	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• The number of opioid poisoning-related EMS calls and ED visits in June were higher compared to previous months and suspect drug deaths were lower. CK's rate of ED visits and suspect drug deaths for 2023 to date is slightly higher than the province. Preliminary 2022 data shows CK experienced a significantly higher rate of opioid poisoning deaths compared to the province (33.3 versus 16.1 per 100,000). Deaths continued to impact males aged 25 to 44 year olds the most, and fentanyl directly contributed to over 90% of deaths.

Emergency Department Visits ³	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• 857 opioid poisoning-related ED visits in June (5400 to date in 2023 or 35.1 per 100,000)
Deaths ⁴	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• 269 suspect drug-related deaths in June (1692 to date in 2023 or 11.0 per 100,000; 3512 deaths in 2022)• 500 confirmed opioid poisoning deaths between January and March 2023 (2435 deaths in 2022 or 16.1 per 100,000)
OVERALL	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• The number of ED visits and suspect drug deaths were comparable to previous months. Suspect drug deaths for the last 3 months are comparable to the previous 3 months but lower compared to the same time period in 2022 and 2021, and still higher than pre-pandemic.

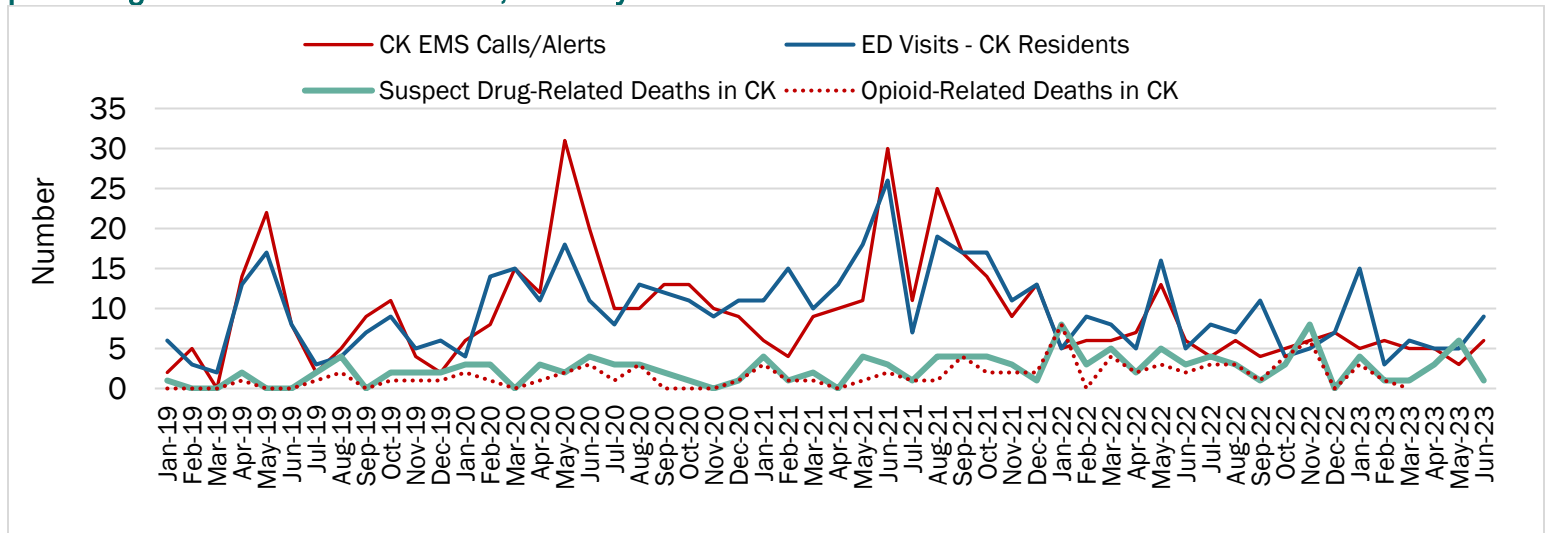
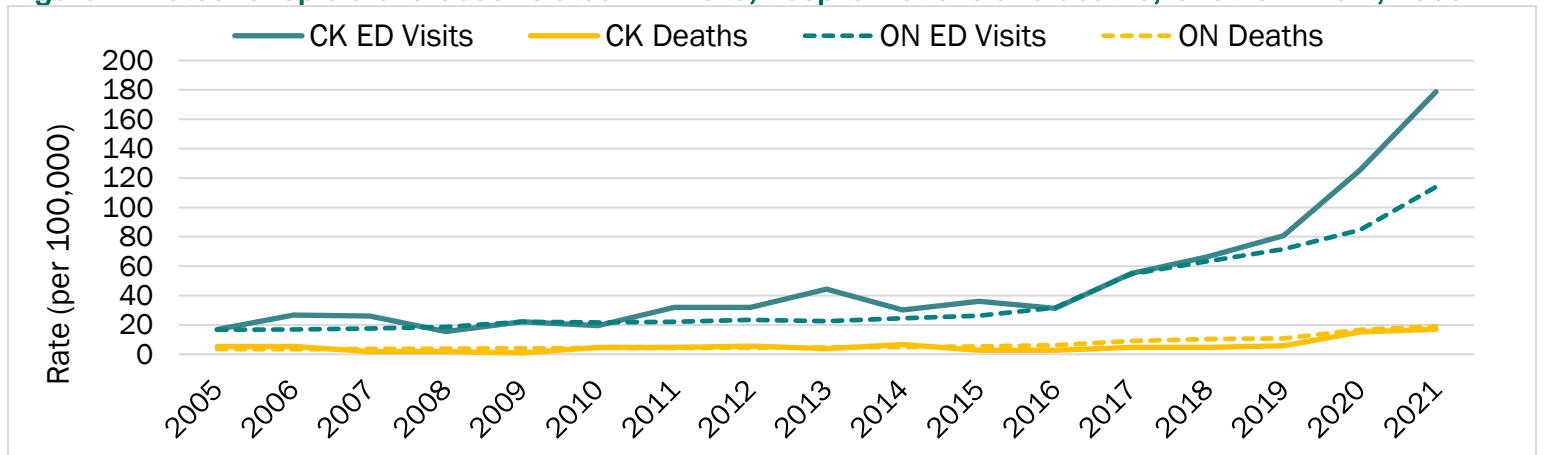


Figure 2. Rates⁴ of opioid overdose-related ED visits, hospitalizations and deaths, Chatham-Kent, 2005-21

- ²EMS calls up to and including June 2023 are based on calls for service by month provided by Chatham-Kent EMS.
- ³Emergency department visits were provided by the Ontario Ministry of Health and Long-Term Care (Weekly emergency department visits for opioid overdose Week 15: July 10-16, 2023). All Ontario hospitals are required to report cases of opioid overdose presenting in their EDs to the Canadian Institute for Health Information. Results are considered preliminary and subject to change as emergency departments continue to submit data. Rates are based on 2022-2023 population projections, and 2019-2021 population estimates.
- ⁴2019 to 2023 suspect drug-related deaths and confirmed opioid deaths are based on the Monthly Summary table provided by the Office of the Chief Coroner for Ontario, July 17, 2023. 2005 to 2021 ED visits, hospitalizations and deaths were obtained from Public Health Ontario's [Interactive Opioid Tool](#). Opioid-related deaths include confirmed deaths only, are considered preliminary and are subject to change as remaining cases are closed by the Office of the Chief Coroner of Ontario.
