Summary Description of the IPAC lapse	The operator commenced provision of tattooing services without prior notification to or inspection by CK Public Health. A site visit investigation was carried out October 19, 2023 by two Public Health Inspectors (PHIs) at the location of operation, 211 Park Street, Chatham ON, N7M 3S1. PHIs met with the operator and two other representatives of the operator. The operator's previous tattoo processes were thoroughly reviewed. The following infractions were observed:  1. Flooring material (carpet) in service area was not easily cleanable.			

	Hand wash sink was not provided in the service area.	
	Ink caps were not disinfected prior to use.	
	4. Single-use impermeable barrier was not used on the tattoo machine.	
	<ol> <li>Single use impermeable barrier was not provided on high touch areas throughout the premises during service provision.</li> </ol>	
	6. Inadequate disinfection of the tattoo machine.	
	7. Single-use impermeable barriers were not provided on tattoo chair and other surfaces that were not easily cleanable.	
	8. Improper storage of the tattoo machine.	
	9. Incomplete client records.
