Summary Description of the IPAC lapse	 The operator commenced provision of tattooing services without prior notification to or inspection by CK Public Health. A site visit investigation was carried out August 14 2024 by a Public Health Inspector (PHI) at the location of operation, 277 Elm St. E Bothwell ON. PHI met with the operator and one other representative of the operator. The operator's previous tattoo processes were thoroughly reviewed. The following infractions were observed: 1. Hand wash sink was not provided in the service area. 			



	2. Inconsistent glove use.			
	3. No use of an appropriate skin antiseptic.			
	4. Ink caps were not disinfected prior to use.			
	5. Inconsistent use of a single-use impermiable barrier on the tattoo machine.			
	 Inconsistent and/or no use of a single- use impermeable barrier provided on high touch areas throughout the premises during service provision. 			
	7. Inadequate disinfection of the tattoo machine.			
	8. Inconsistent disinfection of high-touch surface areas throughout the premises between service provision.			
	9. Incomplete client records.			
	These noted operational infractions pose a risk of bloodborne infection transmission.
